

The regular meeting of the Wayne County Commissioners was held on this date with Commissioner Brian W. Smith presiding. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Smith with Commissioner Joseph W. Adams and Commissioner Jocelyn Cramer present.

The Commissioners were presented with a copy of the minutes from the meeting held March 24, 2022. A motion was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Cramer and unanimous to approve the minutes of the said meeting.

Agenda

Scheduled to meet with the Commissioners: Northeast Regional Cancer Institute President Karen Saunders for the C.A.S.U.A.L. Day proclamation.

Correspondence and Communications

Received a letter of resignation from part-time Corrections Officer Akyra Olsen, effective March 19, 2022. A motion was made by Commissioner Cramer, seconded by Commissioner Adams and unanimous to accept this letter.

The Chief Clerk noted that a previous hiring of Alexis Fawcett, as a Clerk 2 in the Area Agency on Aging, was approved effective March 14, 2022, pending final clearances which were never finalized. A motion was made by Commissioner Cramer, seconded by Commissioner Smith and unanimous to rescind the offer of employment due to final clearances not being finalized.

Received a letter of retirement from Debra Doyle, Emergency Management Agency Administrative Assistant, effective April 8, 2022. A motion was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Cramer and unanimous to accept this letter.

Received notification from the PA Department of Human Services letting the County know that the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 County Human Services Plan has been reviewed and approved.

Received notification from the PA Department of Environmental Protection informing the County the General Permit-105 for Bluestone Mining at the Creamton 1 Operation in Preston Township has been approved.

New Business

The Commissioners held an employee anniversary recognition. The following County employee was in attendance:

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Michael Hull, a Corrections Officer at the Wayne County Correctional Facility, was not present. His certificate will be hand delivered recognizing him for 10 years of service.

Administrative Officer Carl Albright was on hand to introduce Kevin Egan, Van Driver, on his one-year anniversary. Mr. Albright said Mr. Egan is always available and we love to have him here working for us. The Commissioners thanked Mr. Egan for all he does and appreciates what he has done the past year through the pandemic. Mr. Egan said he really enjoys the job and hopes to be around for a while.

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Public Comment

Before Public Comment commenced, Commissioner Smith said he believed everyone gathered to talk about the County's ongoing reassessment. He wanted to offer some background in hopes that he can answer some questions that may be asked and alleviate some concerns. He said the Commissioners started the process of reassessment back in 2018, well before COVID, inflation, the war in Ukraine, the booming housing market and everything else that happened the past four years began. Commissioner Smith said the Commissioners have a board for tax appeals and were constantly seeing inequities and unfairness regarding assessments, since the County has not reassessed since 2004. We are having homes built now worth well over \$1 million but assessed at 2004 rates, which could be as much as one quarter what the assessment should be. Too many times we found those who own the most expensive homes are not paying their fair share. By law we cannot spot assess. The only thing we can do to make things as fair as possible is a countywide reassessment. As we have gone through this process, we have found homes, garages, sheds and additions that have been built that slipped through the cracks and do not appear on our tax roles, Every time that happens, everyone else is paying too much. That is why it is so important to do these countywide reassessments.

Commissioner Cramer said we welcome the conversation, because the more we talk about reassessment, and why we are doing this, and that our only goal is fairness, the more people understand. She can tell you by the two years she has been here what Commissioner Smith said is absolutely correct. We have all seen the inequities in assessment and we know this is needed to make things fair.

Commissioner Adams noted that this will be revenue neutral and he believes the same will be in effect for municipalities and the schools are governed by Act 1, which also has a windfall rule in effect. He said the notices of proposed assessment that were mailed out should be reviewed by each property owner. If anyone sees something that is wrong, they should schedule an informal appeal immediately.

Commissioner Smith noted his own information was incorrect as it said he had four bathrooms, and only has two, and a chimney, when he does not have one.

With that said, the Board opened public comment.

Jessica Barnes, a Real Estate Agent from Damascus Township, asked what we can do to make sure we do not continue to have inequities in county assessments. Commissioner Smith said there are proposals to have legislation mandate reassessment every so many years. Ms. Barnes asked why the County cannot do reassessments on property is resolved like they do in New York state. Ms. Barnes asked how much this reassessment cost the County. Solicitor Wendell Kay said that would be considered a spot assessment and Pennsylvania courts have ruled they are not allowed. Commissioner Adams said the cost is \$1.28 million, but was done through savings by refinancing a bond when the rates were at historic lows. No tax increase was needed to pay for the reassessment.

Ms. Barnes said she thinks people are seeing these new assessment numbers and are concerned, but do not understand what it means. Commissioner Adams said just because their assessment value goes up 80%, that does not mean their taxes will go up 80%.

Ms. Barnes said she does not blame the County for having picked this time. Commissioner Adams noted the dates for comparable rates are from January 1, 2019 to June 30, 2021. Ms. Barnes asked what people should do before they come in for formal and informal appeals. Commissioner Cramer emphasized making sure all the data is correct. That included construction type, square footage, number of rooms, roof type, year built and flooring.

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Commissioner Smith also made it clear that Clean and Green values were not reflected in the notices that were sent out.

Pete Quaglia, Tyler Hill, Damascus Township, asked about windfall protections time frames and limits. Commissioner Adams and Solicitor Kay both reiterated what they already mentioned regarding both.

Kathy Sheppard, of Honesdale, wanted to talk about a Maple Tour and how wonderful it was.

Judy Joyce, Equinunk, Manchester Township, said her assessment went up 129%.

David Nilsen, Honesdale Borough, said lots of his questions and concerns were already addressed. He said as a Borough Councilman, while he had an audience with the Commissioners, asked about available County funds for blight removal and if the County was interested in the LERTA Program. The Commissioners told him there is a Task Force locally with the American Rescue Plan fund that may be used for blight and Solicitor Kay said the first step for LERTA would be by the municipality.

New Business

Northeast Regional Cancer Institute President Karen Saunders was on hand to talk about C.A.S.U.A.L. Day and the importance of testing and early detection when it comes to colorectal cancer. She said with so many people during COVID not going to the doctors, she worries things may have been missed and she urged people to get screened as soon as possible. Commissioner Smith said early detection is clearly saving lives and is certainly a worthwhile cause and thanked her for being on hand to promote it. A motion was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Jocelyn to adopt the C.A.S.U.A.L. Day proclamation in Wayne County.

A motion was made by Commissioner Cramer, seconded by Commissioner Smith and unanimous to enter into a M.O.U. with Penn State University's Penn State Extension for three years for extension office services from April 1, 2022 through March 31, 2024.

A motion was made by Commissioner Cramer, seconded by Commissioner Smith and unanimous to accept the recommendation of the Wayne County Tourism Promotion Committee and request that the Pocono Mountain Visitor Bureau fund the approved grants from the Tourism Project Disbursement Allocation Program as listed:

Northeastern Pennsylvania Maple Syrup Producers Association -- \$195.31
Roots and Rhythm -- \$7,750
Newfoundland Sip and Stroll -- \$3,285

A motion was made by Commissioner Cramer, seconded by Commissioner Smith and unanimous to approve the use of the County's Park Street Complex for a polling place for Honesdale's 2nd Precinct on May 17, 2022.

A motion was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Adams and unanimous to accept the recommendation of the Roamingwood Sewer and Water Association to reappoint Carolyn Hanel to another five-year-term on the South Wayne Sewer Authority through January 1, 2027.
