

The regular meeting of the Wayne County Commissioners was held on this date with Commissioner Brian W. Smith presiding. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Smith with Commissioner Joseph W. Adams and Commissioner Jocelyn Cramer present.

The Commissioners were presented with a copy of the minutes from the meeting held June 4, 2020. A motion was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Cramer and unanimous to approve the minutes of the said meeting.

Agenda

Scheduled to meet with the Commissioners: Randy Heller, Recycling/Solid Waste Director; David J. Harvey on Honesdale Peaceful Protest.

Items to be considered: Elected Certification update; County Green Phase; Award bid for Bear Swamp Road Bridge Rehabilitation; Appoint Deputy County Solicitor; 1099 Agreement for professional legal services; Salary Board meeting; COVID-19 update; Payment of bills.

Correspondence and Communications

Received a copy of The Manor newsletter from the Equinunk Historical Society for May 2020.

A letter was received from Lee C. Krause informing of his retirement as the County Solicitor effective July 3, 2020. Commissioner Adams said he accepts Mr. Krause's retirement with regret and great admiration for the job he has done. Commissioner Smith stated that Mr. Krause has kept the county out of legal issues numerous times. He cares deeply about due process and the people he represents. Vicky Botjer stated that it will be difficult to replace his institutional knowledge. Attorney Krause stated that the County has been the corner stone of his practice for a lot of years. Krause has great admiration for the Commissioner he worked with. They have all served with integrity and honesty and truly work together as a team. I am proud to be part of it for 40 years.

New Business

Randy Heller, Recycling/Solid Waste Director, announced a plan for the full opening of the Recycling Center saying that they are going to be open Monday through Friday. They will not resumed Saturdays until he has an intern or part-timer. Once they do they will resume.

Public Comment

District Attorney A.G. Howell and Sheriff Mark Steelman were called upon to speak. District Attorney Howell was asked about information he received from law enforcement regarding the June 3 Black Lives Matter protest in Central Park. District Attorney Howell said that prior to the event, law enforcement received credible information about threatening disruption to the community before the protest. Law enforcement was put into place to promote peaceful protesting. Based on intelligence from law enforcement and what was occurring in communities across the country, the PA State Police, Wayne County Sheriff's Department, County Detectives and officers from the Honesdale, Hawley and Lehigh Township Police Department were close by in case anything happens. Thankfully no law enforcement intervention was needed.

Sheriff Steelman says, as a member of law enforcement, for you to get one piece of information it is treated as creditable until proven otherwise. Sheriff Steelman commented that this protest is how a protest is supposed to be.

Commissioner Smith stated that he has spoken at rallies and one of our basic premises of our freedom is that we all have a responsibility to encourage change when warranted. If the

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Commissioners receive credible information from our District Attorney or law enforcement, the worst mistake they could make would be not to say anything and see things go badly.

At this time, the Commissioners opened the floor for public comment.

Jack Barnett, Lakeville, said the atmosphere was not appropriate for a peaceful protest and asked the Commissioners to speak at a protest.

Barbara Lewis, Honesdale, said that she has become increasingly aware that racism has been condoned and institutionalized for far too long. For decades disproportionately larger numbers of black men have been brutalized by police and incarcerated in our prisons. We need to stand up for our brothers and sisters of color in our daily conduct of our lives, as well as at our peaceful protests. We need leaders in government at all levels to see that the reforms that are needed to assure equal rights for all people are enacted and implemented effectively in our communities. We are counting on you as our commissioners to be our leaders in Wayne County to see that equal protection of all people becomes a reality in our local communities as well as across the United States.

Amanda Dimasi, Honesdale, organizer of the protest, told the Commissioners she was threatened at the rally and was dismayed with community leaders and state police and others who told organizers the protest should not happen. It broke her heart there was such division in our community.

Claire Harvey, Honesdale, while she was not at the protest, she was glad there was no violence concerns and that false tips of trouble quickly turn into fact that gets out of hand. This tactic has been happening across the country tarnishing peaceful protests by scaring organizers and communities.

Lisa Glover, Honesdale, spoke directly to Commissioner Adams criticizing the comments he made to the Wayne Pike News. She felt its harming local business and residents who want to peacefully protest. She was harassed and threatened about the protest.

Stephen Moulten, Honesdale, told the Commissioners that what was said earlier he agreed with. He appreciates the ability to address the Commissioners on this topic. Without conversation we cannot have cooperation without cooperation we cannot grow as a community.

David J. Harvey, Honesdale, thanked Commissioner Adams for his many community efforts and says he has a wonderful reputation but also said the Commissioners need to do a better job next time. Mr. Harvey said there is racism in this town. He also believes they were targeted by misinformation. Mr. Harvey said this protest was trying to be suppressed. He described how social media is fanning flames. Mr. Harvey said the Commissioners and other elected officials need to do a better job of not doing the same.

Commissioner Smith addressed everyone saying he appreciated them being at the meeting to express their concerns but said county officials cannot take a chance and say we have a threat but choose to ignore it.

Commissioner Adams said it was better to be prepared. There is no doubt we have issues in the County and he made no role in closing any businesses. Commissioner Adams said the Commissioners' intentions were meant well. As to the Wayne Pike News story, Commissioner Adams criticized it and noted that the Commissioners don't write the headlines. He said some of his comments were edited out of his statement in the article.

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Commissioner Cramer spoke saying that the best communication is face to face and agreed there is a lack of diversity here. Commissioner Cramer told those gathered they have heightened the Commissioners service and that a lot of good will come from this.

New Business

Commissioner Cramer gave an update on the Election Bureau certification process. The Commissioners have signed the unofficial election results on Wednesday and the public has five (5) business days to review these results and file any objection they have. If there are no objections by the end of the business day on June 16, these results will be certified and sent to the PA Department of State to become official.

A motion was made by Commissioner Adams, seconded by Commissioner Smith and unanimous for the lifting of travel restrictions and some county building entry restrictions for the Green Phase.

A motion was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Cramer and unanimous to award the Bear Swamp Road Bridge Rehabilitation Project to the lowest responsible bidder, based on the County Engineer's review, to Pioneer Construction for \$171,374.35. Commissioner Adams noted that these funds came from Liquid Fuels not county funds and the bids came in close to what the County Engineer predicted they would.

A motion was made by Commissioner Adams, seconded by Commissioner Cramer and unanimous to appoint Wendell R. Kay as Deputy County Solicitor effective June 15, 2020 with the deputy designation being removed on July 3, 2020.

A motion was made to enter into a 1099 Agreement for professional services with Wendell R. Kay for legal services effective June 15, 2020. The fee shall be the sum of \$3,750.00 per month for the remainder of 2020 to represent Wayne County and all-inclusive programs. The June 2020 rate will be prorated at \$1,875.00 to correspond with the June 15, 2020 start date. Payment will be processed the first full week of every month through a recurring invoice.

Wendell Kay spoke and said he is excited to work with the Commissioners to promote Wayne County. Lee Krause said he will be a great Solicitor and is more than capable. Commissioner Smith stated that Attorney Kay has a tremendous amount of knowledge of the County and the law. He can step right in and to a tremendous job. Commissioner Adams said he has 40 years experience as an Attorney and 12 years as a Commissioner and his institutional knowledge is important to the position.

A motion was made by Commissioner Cramer, seconded by Commissioner Adams and unanimous to promote Jeff Legg to the position of Security Specialist/9-1-1 GIS Tech for Wayne County, effective June 15, 2020.

At this time, the Commissioners recessed to hold a Salary Board meeting. See Salary Board minutes.

The Commissioners' meeting resumed.

A motion was made by Commissioner Adams, seconded by Commissioner Cramer and unanimous to approve the promotion of Melissa McWilliams, from a Drug and Alcohol Prevention Specialist Trainee to a Drug and Alcohol Prevention Specialist, effective June 15, 2020.

At this time, the Commissioners recessed to hold a Salary Board meeting. See Salary Board minutes.

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The Commissioners’ meeting resumed.

A motion was made by Commissioner Cramer, seconded by Commissioner Adams and unanimous to approve a 4.5 percent increase for Shannon Joyal, County Caseworker 2 at Wayne County Children and Youth, for her achievement of attaining her Master of Social Work Degree, effective June 15, 2020.

At this time, the Commissioners recessed to hold a Salary Board meeting. See Salary Board minutes.

The Commissioners’ meeting resumed.

COVID-19 Update

The Chief Clerk and Commissioner Smith gave an update as to what green means for County operation. Wayne County facilities are fully open to the public with some restrictions in place.

Visitors are encouraged to make an appointment with the specific department they wish to visit whenever possible. All visitors and employees are strongly encouraged to wear a mask to gain access via public entrance to any Wayne County facility and by visitors while in the building. It is also recommended that employees wear a mask while interacting with the public if social distancing measures are not possible.

Anyone seeking to access Wayne County buildings and facilities will be denied if you are exhibiting signs or symptoms of COVID-19. Those here for court related matters should call 570-253-0101 immediately and your situation will be addressed.

Conditions that will prevent your access to the courthouse include, but is not limited to, those who:

- Have symptoms of lower respiratory illness, such as a cough or shortness of breath;
- A fever of 100.4 degrees or above;
- Have come into contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days;
- Have travelled internationally or gone on an ocean cruise in the past 14 days.

This policy is effective June 12, 2020 and remains in effect until further notice. No exceptions will be granted. We appreciate your understanding that this is the best interest of our staff, yourselves and the community, county and country as a whole.

Commissioner Cramer emphasized that people with illness symptoms or fever to not enter the Courthouse. Commissioner Adams noted that there was great efficiency by all to get to this phase so quickly. The County is being rewarded for their effort with keeping the numbers low.

Other Business

The Commissioners received a copy of the Treasurer’s Report dated June 10, 2020.

A motion was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Cramer and unanimous to approve the following bills for payment, as presented, which includes Checks No. 113973 through 114042.
