

## ACCEPTABLE FOR RECYCLING

- Clear, Brown & Green Glass
- Metal & Aluminum Cans
- #1 & #2 Plastic Bottles
- Tires (see inside)
- Refrigerant Program (see inside)
- Newspapers
- Magazines, Office Paper, & Junk Mail
- Hard Cover and Paper Back Books
- Corrugated Cardboard
- Brown Grocery Bags
- Scrap Metal & Appliances

Such as: Hot Water Heaters, Furnaces, BBQ Grills, Microwave Ovens, Metal Desks, Lawn Mowers (all fluids drained), Bicycle Frames, Lawn Chair Frames, Old Swing Set Frames, Washers and Dryers, Stoves, & Ranges.

### Chipboard

Such as: Cereal Boxes, Tissue Boxes, Shoe Boxes, Gift Boxes, Dry and Frozen Food Boxes, & Paper Product End Rolls.

**Please remove all bag inserts and flatten boxes.**

## NOT ACCEPTABLE FOR RECYCLING

Soda and beer packs (considered "wet strength" and are treated with a chemical that will not break down in water).

Bag inserts from cereal boxes


Pizza boxes (because of grease)

Dishwasher soap boxes & laundry detergent boxes (wax inside)

Ice cream boxes (wax inside)

Drink boxes (wax inside)

Milk cartons (wax inside)

Clam shell plastic containers (berries & salads commonly sold in these) even if they're a 

**NO PROPANE TANKS**



It's the right thing to do!

**Saves Energy** – Using recycled paper, glass, and metal helps save energy. Less oil needs to be imported when we recycle.

**Saves Natural Resources** – Recycling saves trees, oil, & metals.

**Reduces Pollution** – Use of recyclables in manufacturing reduces pollution of water and air. This reduces acid rain and health problems caused by pollution.

**Creates Jobs** – Manufacturing jobs are created by making recyclables into new products.

**Saves Money** – Helps control the cost of solid waste disposal.

**Saves Landfill Space** – Your trash is taking up space in a landfill – make that trash as little as possible.

## SPECIAL PROGRAMS

### TIRE RECYCLING PROGRAM

(P) PASSENGER VEHICLE

or

(LT) LIGHT TRUCK TIRES

**\$3.00 Off Rim**

**\$5.00 Mounted On Rim**

**\$10.00 Large Commercial Tires Off Rim**

Must be free of water and debris.

### REFRIGERANT PROGRAM

FREEZERS, REFRIGERATORS,  
DEHUMIDIFIERS, AIR CONDITIONERS, etc.

**A Nominal \$15.00 Evacuation Fee**

### General Information

1. Empty and rinse all containers.
2. Do not crush glass.
3. Papers need not be tied if delivered to the recycling center.

### What else can I do?

1. Only buy products that YOU can recycle.
2. Compost your yard and food waste.
3. Volunteer as a helper at your recycling site.

Put all non-recyclables into your regular trash as usual. Do not burn your garbage. Open burning pollutes the air you breathe and harms the environment.

# What to recycle at your Municipal Drop-Off Site

<p><b>GLASS BOTTLES</b></p> 	<p>Empty and rinse. Labels may stay on. Separate by colors – clear, brown, &amp; green. <b>DO NOT BREAK GLASS.</b></p> <p><b>Do not include with glass bottles:</b> windows, mirrors, light bulbs, white glass, dishes, drinking glasses, pyrex, heat tempered glass, or ceramics.</p>
<p><b>METAL CANS</b></p> 	<p>All food and beverage cans (aluminum &amp; tin.) Empty and rinse. Labels may stay on.</p> <p><b>Do not include with metal cans:</b> pie plates, foil, paint cans, aerosol cans, pots and pans, fuel tanks, coat hangers, or other metal items.</p>
<p><b>PLASTIC BOTTLES</b></p> 	<p><b>BOTTLES ONLY</b> (Must have a neck) Milk, soda, water, and detergent bottles marked with  or  on the bottom. Empty and rinse.</p> <p><b>Do not include with plastic bottles:</b> plastic bags, tubs, trays, toys, or other plastic items, even if they are labeled  or . No styrofoam.</p> <p>No plastic bottles with a 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7 inside the recycling symbol. No motor oil bottles. <b>No clam shell plastic containers</b> (i.e. berries and salads commonly sold in these) even if they are a .</p>
<p><b>NEWSPAPERS</b></p> 	<p>Includes clean newspapers and newspaper inserts. Keep dry, clean, and out of sunlight. Place in neat stacks and tie with heavy string or twine. Do not tie with plastic, wire, cloth, or pantyhose. May also be placed in brown grocery bags.</p> <p><b>Do not include with newspapers:</b> phone books, junk mail, cardboard or magazines.</p>
<p><b>MAGAZINES</b></p> 	<p>Includes catalogs, magazines, office paper, junk mail, and phone books. Tie with heavy string or twine separately from newspaper. Do not tie with plastic, wire, cloth, or pantyhose. May also be placed in brown grocery bags.</p> <p><b>Do not include with magazines:</b> cardboard, newspapers, hardback books.</p>

Please take special note that just because an item is marked RECYCLABLE or is marked with recycling arrows, it does NOT automatically mean it is recyclable under our program. Not sure? Call us!
